There's a scenic scuba "walking track" stretching for some 620 metres underwater at Gordons Bay, Clovelly. Divers follow chains attached to the rocks, with various places marked by numbered plates — at least they were. At the weekend, plates 5,6,7,8 and 9, with the shackles attaching them, were stolen. John Rowe, who built the track, says the theft was as pointless as that of shackles stolen from the Water Board's anti-rubbish boom at Rushcutters Bay (Column 8, yesterday).
